ARTIST STATEMENT

The starting point of Bede Kincső's work is, on one hand, the ever-present and eternal dilemma: how can generations with different historical experiences live together and collaborate within the family and communities, in a broader sense. The other is to confront and deal with the legacy of socialism, that unspoken historical past which creates tensions within Eastern European societies in a radically changed socio-economic and personal context. She responds to the issues that interest and affect us all deeply with a mode of expression and formal language characteristic of her generation, while evoking at the same time topos of cultural history in a very authentic way, creating an individual mythology.

She approaches her subject boldly and concisely to present the ambivalent relationship of children to their parents' traumas, while also giving personal insight into old and new problems. It is reassuring to see how even the most brutal phenomena become dusty and banal over time, while we can observe with some scepticism that even though each generation gives birth to another, each of them somehow closes in on its problems.

SHORT BIO

Kincső Bede (b.1995) is a Romanian visual artist with Hungarian roots, who grew up in a small city in Transylvania, Romania. She is fascinated by the communist past of her homeland, the power of the leader Nicolae Ceauşescu, the control exercised by the security agency Securitate, and how this history is passed down across the generations. Currently, Kincső lives and works in Budapest, Hungary and she is studied at the Moholy-Nagy University of Art and Design.

She is part of the Studio of Young Photographers. In 2020 she won the photography scholarship of the Association of Hungarian Photographers. In the same year she was among the winners of Carte Blanche Students, a scholarship founded by Paris Photo. The works of the four winners were exhibited at the Parisian Gare du Nord. Her series, titled "Three Colours I Know in This World" was chosen for the 10 New Talent 2020 programme by the curators of BredaPhoto Festival and was exhibited in The Netherlands. Her work is often applauded by the foreign press, like: GUP Magazine, The Steidz, Grandmamas Print, The Art News Paper Edition Francaise, Hotpotatonews, VOGUE Italy, VOGUE China, ELLE Italy. Also, her photos are part of the Blurring the Lines 2020 issue. In 2021 she was exhibited at UNSEEN, in Amsterdam, and

In 2022, she was awarded the prize intitled: PhMuseum Photography Grant as a New Generational Prize – Honorable Mention, in the same year her work were exhibited at the PhotoVogue Festival in Milan and at the PHOTO ISRAEL International Photography Festival in Tel-Aviv.

From 2020 she is representd by TOBE Gallery, in Budapest.

ELINA BROTHERUS



Elina Brotherus works in photography and moving image. Her work has been alternating between autobiographical and art-historical approaches. Photographs dealing with the human figure and the landscape, the relation of the artist and the model, gave way to images on subjective experiences in her recent bodies of work Annonciation and Carpe Fucking Diem. In her current work she is revisiting Fluxus event scores and other written instructions for performance-oriented art of the 1950s-70s.

Elina Brotherus lives and works in Helsinki, Finland and Avallon, France. She has an MA degree in Photography from the University of Art and Design Helsinki (now Aalto University) and an MSc in Chemistry from the University of Helsinki. She started exhibiting internationally in 1997. Her works are in public collections including the Pompidou Centre, Paris, Kiasma Museum of Contemporary Art, Helsinki, Moderna Museet, Stockholm, Museum Folkwang, Essen, and MAXXI, Rome, to name a few.

Her work has been given prominence in numerous art and photography books and magazines. She has published eleven monographs, most recently 'Seabound. A Logbook' with AKO Kunststiftelse and Kehrer Verlag. She has been awarded, among others, Carte blanche PMU, France, in 2017, the Finnish State Prize for Photography in 2008, and the Prix Niépce in 2005.

"I can only acknowledge that work follows life. I made autobiographical self-portraits in the very beginning of my career while still in art school. At the same time I finished my previous university studies of chemistry and my first marriage. It was a major liberation on all fronts and it had to become visible in my photography. Then, for ten years, I did other things – I was interested in painting, the way artists look at their models and how to represent this in a picture. I was using myself as a model but the photos didn't talk about what was going on in my life. I was an image-maker, dealing with formal, visual and art-historical issues. Then I approached 40 and life got complicated and the autobiography sneaked in again. It wasn't anything I planned but I didn't push it back either. This is my strategy as an artist: to accept the pictures that need to happen."

SUSAN COPICH



Ohio-raised and New York-based photographer Susan Copich has since 2010 been making highly staged and carefully crafted self-portraits. Her work reflects on the dark sides of contemporary American femininity, domesticity, motherhood, and the artist's inner psychological dramas in ways that that are both alarming and amusing, over-the-top and relatable. Her work has been shown in museums, galleries and private collections around the world.

PROCESS

I employ a classical sense of theater casting myself as both symbol and subject posed in idealized choreography. The drama is set in environments much like the painterly convention of "tableau vivant" with the open ended story seemingly frozen in time. The subject matter is the story of all women as we struggle within societal roles to defy them or be devoured by them. In each photo, I pose as an allegorical symbol creating a poetic moment or the middle of a narrative. Rather than losing myself in personal revery, I deliberately engage the viewer who is forced into roles of witness, audience and accessory.

I rummage around the sinister side of domesticity. The monotony, the grinding servitude it is cloaked in while simultaneously dressing it up with ripped from the pages of magazine pop and glamour--giving it an accessibility, an invitation for all to consume. I consciously craft the central figure, the woman, the archetypal mother-figure, a 3-dimensional experience expressed throughout the project--rather than a flat, repetitive single dimensional existence. I examine the female figure from multiple sides, to challenge the dangerous ideology of perfection and reveal and REVEL in the dynamic qualities of good to bad, beautiful to ugly, nurturing to selfish or loving to violent. It encourages a complete expression and a shedding of this myth of perfection.



Melanie Issaka: Locating the Personal

What is Blackness? Ask a hundred people and you'll receive a hundred answers. It is a history, a canon stretching back through time. It is a colour, a pigmentation of the skin. A story, a commonality, an experience, a family. In the work of Melanie Issaka, shades of brown are nowhere to be seen, yet Blackness seeps into the images – just as her light-sensitive chemicals do. Issaka conjures blackness, playing with its materiality, presenting her British-Ghanian identity with ghostly opacity; Blackness from the void, race from the ether.

Deeply concerned with the photographic history of race, Issaka turns her own body into an investigation site, a study of the Black female form. Since the birth of the camera, the lens has served colonial agendas, generating visual racial identities, all tightly gripped by the eyes and hands of the white beholder. To quote Mark Sealy, "Photography, when read within the context of European imperialism, has the capacity to function as a morbid reminder of the intense level of cultural violence that was aimed at the Other over centuries." There is an uncomfortable dynamic, a dirty history still trapped within the camera. It is a ghost, unable to move on, still feeding into our contemporary visualisation of race. This is the context Issaka finds herself within. A photographic history in which the Black form, the Black female form, exists to serve white viewers.

Issaka begins her subversion by throwing the camera out altogether. Working in isolation throughout the British Covid-19 Lockdown, the artist lined her bedroom floor with photosensitive paper, reclining atop the material, "taking up space." Issaka becomes the master of her own world; subject, documentor, camera, material, and background all exist within herself. Issaka turns her gaze to herself, creating ghostly echoes of her own relaxation, a place in which she exists on nobody's terms but her own. Here, Blackness generates itself. Another ghost is formed, yet this one isn't bound to the camera. She spreads across the paper, free-flowing and self-determined.

For too long the camera has aimed to "capture" Blackness, to jar it shut, and trap it within chemicals and paper, to be used however the white eye deems fit. The perceived Black body rarely gets to rest, lie down, and simply exist. Issaka rejects this "violent" photography, replacing it with her own Black psychogeography. In her images, Blackness does whatever Blackness wants.



CLOE JANCIS



Cloe Jancis (born 1992) is an Estonian artist who operates across the mediums of photography, video, drawing, and installation. She graduated from the Estonian Academy of Arts with a bachelor's degree in photography (2018) and is presently enrolled in the master's program of the Faculty of Liberal Arts at the Estonian Academy of Arts. Jancis's artistic exploration revolves around the multifaceted representation of women in society, encompassing their everyday roles, prevailing myths, societal expectations, and intricate emotional landscapes. Recently, her creative endeavors have focused on the symbolism and rituals intertwined with the portrayal of femininity. Through her works, she positions herself at the center as both the creator and the subject, utilizing performance and performativity as fundamental tools of expression. This interplay between personal introspection and societal dynamics characterizes the essence of her artistic narrative, straddling the boundary between the profoundly intimate and the broader social impulses.



JOHANNA KEIMEYER



PHILOSOPHY

Johanna Keimeyer is an experiential artist who creates immersive experiences using interdisciplinary forms. This can take the form of large scale art installations transforming site specific architecture with video, light, objects, scent and sound. Her strength is to create participatory art experiences that combine cutting edge technology with art, fashion and design. Her ultimate focus is to allow the viewer to explore profound questions about identity and humanity's values. Her motivation for her art is to make the invisible visible.

"I want to give people a felt experience that unifies the artwork and the viewer's own inner universe. I invite the audience to explore deeper questions about identity and the core fundamental values that make us human."

BIOGRAPHY

Keimeyer studied design and digital media at University of the Arts in Berlin (UdK), Tama Art University in Tokyo, the Rhode Island School of Design (RISD) in Rhode Island, USA, and Boston's MIT Media Lab, USA.

Her previous work includes a series of lighting made from recycled materials and her underwater photography in hotel pools around the world. She is continuing to explore those topics and practices as an experiential artist with interdisciplinary forms.

Keimeyer has worked in the art collections of Hugues and Marie Taittinger (Tattinger Champagne, France), Petch Osathanugrah (O Museum, Bangkok), Alexander von Vegesack (former Vitra Design Museum Director), Lucas Verweij (Design Author), the Leo Kuelbs Collection and more.

Her current practice as an experiential artist is drawn from her experience working for Vitra Design (Herman Miller in the US) and collaborating with designers and artists from various backgrounds and expertise including: Ingo Maurer (lighting designer), Humberto and Fernando Campana (furniture designers, Brazil), Bart Hess (fashion designer), Felix Kubin (musician), Sven Helbig (composer), Sevil Peach (architect), Jonah Bokaer (choreographer) and Sissel Tolaas (olfactive designer).

Exploring spirituality and identity through portraits

Berlin based artist Johanna Keimeyer uncovers identity through portraits of icons and goddesses

The self-portrait photography series ICONIC PORTRAITS I and ICONIC PORTRAITS II by Berlin-based artist Johanna Keimeyer will be exhibited at Haze Gallery and Notagallery in Berlin, as well as a videoinstallation.

With the second part of the photo series ICONIC PORTRAITS II, the artist Johanna Keimeyer questions human identity anew. In this analogue photographic metamorphosis, she focuses on various famous figures. The portrayed are icons like Einstein, Dalí, Chaplin, Mozart. For the first time, the artist expands the series with her own interpretations of spiritual personalities, mythical warriors and goddesses who represent a symbol of female power, such as Joan of Arc, Boudica, Buddha, Golden Buddha, Sacred Dancer and Kali.

Keimeyer creates the characters with modern designs such as corsets by Hoermanseder, fetish outfits by Perlensau, Butcherei Lindinger, jewelry by Luise Zücker and outfits by Herr von Eden. The make-up looks represent a large part of the design with which Johanna embodies the characters in front of the camera.

Keimeyer's essence represents the interplay of spirituality and art.

"My art also has the task of shifting boundaries of consciousness, and this can of course only be done through emotion, and only with the most essential questions about the meaning of life and death, about faith and about absolute humanity. My art is meant to help people to interpret things freely and a tool to reflect on their perceptions of themselves, to move them emotionally. It is precisely when the boundaries between real and unreal worlds blur that something special emerges, and art fulfills its purpose of making the invisible visible. As an artist, I am always struggling between several worlds, and the art is not to get lost in them."

These images aim to inspire to find in yourself what you want to fulfill with your life and also leave behind. Every person writes themselves into history. Johanna Keimeyer expresses absolute hope, trust and meaning through the symbolism of the photographs and the theatrical images. Johanna Keimeyer has had numerous exhibitions and performances in renowned galleries and museums in Europe, Asia and the USA. In 2021 she showed the first part of this work in Taiwan, where she participated in an artist-in-residence cultural exchange at the Taipei Artist Village.

About Johanna Keimeyer:

Johanna Keimeyer (born 1982) studied design and digital media at University of the Arts (UdK), Berlin, at Tama Art University Tokyo, and at Rhode Island School of Design (RISD), USA and MIT Media Lab, Boston, USA.

As an experiential artist, she creates immersive experiences, transforming architectural highlights into emotional experiences with video, light, and sound with large scale installations. Johanna Keimeyer's work is in prestigious art collections - see her website for more information.

I am currently doing my M.A. studies at FH Bielefeld, residing and creating between there and in my home in Bremen – always working on personal projects which focus on feminism, female* empowernment, youth, relationships, family, freedom, selflove, identity and the challenges of our twenties. I combine photographs, preferably shoot on 35mm or middle format film, with self-written poems and find my inspiration in the emotions around me or within myself.

The art of photography gives you a voice, a chance to communicate. And there are many voices that need to be heard and many stories that need to be seen. I am here to do exactly that.

I am currently working on an analogue project about endometriosis, a menstrual disorder that one out of ten humans with an uterus suffers with and that is sadly not talked or taught about enough. Stay tuned for more.

NINA RÖDER



*1983 Germany

Nina Röder studied Media Art and Design with the focus on photography at Bauhaus University in Weimar/Germany. Next to her artistic activities she holds a Ph.D. in the field of artistic research. Her research focus lies on performative strategies in contemporary photography in the context of contingency. Nina's works have been shown in international festivals and museums, such as the GoaPhoto Festival in India, the European Month of Photography in Berlin or the Format Festival in Derby/UK.

Nina's artistic focus is on photographic works that negotiate sublime structures of biographical narratives and combine aspects of the performative with the time-based image space of photography. The often absurd or poetic atmosphere of her scenographies conveys the tension of her figures' biographical experiences. The series about her family are explicitly searching for hidden and historical mechanisms of personality development and inherited traumas. A whimsical - often humorous - approach plays a crucial role. Since 2017 she is a professor of photography at University of Europe for Applied Sciences in Hamburg.

Nina Röder lives and works in Hamburg and Berlin.

The works Fliegerbrille, Muschelmund, Omas Falten in Blau und Puppenhände belong to the series CHAMPAGNE IN THE BASEMENT:

When my grandparents died in 2017, my family had to clear out their house within a week and eventually sell it. Most of the grandparents' belongings were packed away randomly - only a few mementos were deliberately selected and stored in a basement room in my mother's house in Windsbach, Bavaria. At the beginning of 2020, the door of this room was opened again for the first time. With an ambivalence of astonishment and melancholy, all the objects, furnishings and above all the clothes of my grandmother were examined. It was in this same basement room that my mother and I staged portraits, self-portraits and still lifes for the camera during the first Corona Lockdown, using the objects we had picked up to create a stage for a theatre of the absurd. The series CHAMPAGNER IM KELLER joins my works about my family, in which I encounter loss and grief in a performative and humorous way. The series was created with the kind support of LEICA CAMERA DEUTSCHLAND.

The work What happens in M stays in M belongs to the series Marienbad am Meer:

At the end of the 1920s, Röder's great-grandfather Josef Behr worked as a concierge at the hotel then called "Bayrischer Hof" in Marienbad, Czech Republic; his family lived in the neighbouring village of Stokov. Röder's grandparents belonged to the German-speaking minority of the so-called Sudeten Germans in Bohemia - an area in what was then Czechoslovakia. After the end of the Second World War, this population group was resettled in Germany. The family narrative, driven primarily by Röder's grandmother, is that the place Marienbad was longingly called home.



Since her childhood, Röder regularly travelled to that spa with her family and is confronted with her grandmother's glorified memories. Accordingly, Marienbad is stylised in Röder's series as a utopian place of longing in allusion to William Shakespeare and Ingeborg Bachmann. Röder thereby alludes to the fictional place in William Shakespeare's comedy A Winter's Tale: Bohemia. A desert country near the sea. She borrows the title of her series from Bachmann's poem "Bohemia lies by the sea", in which, similar to the memories of her grandmother, a utopian ideal state is thematised. With this series, Röder finally ties in with earlier works on family narratives that follow the desire for knowledge about one's own origins.

Today's neo-kitsch aesthetic of the city can be seen as "too decadent for today's taste". Röder uses this very place as the backdrop for a game with biographical and fictional identity constructions. In the apparent easiness of Marienbad, Röder repeatedly stages her mother in absurd and bizarre situations alongside erotically connoted motifs. The glamour of the old days is palpable, the melancholy is more evident.

EMMA SARPANIEMI



Emma Sarpaniemi (b. 1993, Helsinki, Finland) is an artist and photographer based in Helsinki. In her practice, Sarpaniemi investigates definitions of femininity through performative and collaborative self-portraits. She creates a playful and tender representation of a woman using herself as the character to behave, look and perform on her terms and rules. The world Sarpaniemi builds is blurred between her identity, reality, and imagination.

The starting point for Sarpaniemi's self-portraits is often an object or clothing she finds from a flea market through which she starts to construct the image. Sarpaniemi is interested in using daily life objects in an unpredictable way to create a contradiction in the photograph. The idea is to merge the familiar element in a context that it's not intended to use.

Self-portraiture is a playground for Sarpaniemi, where the artist's aim is to question traditional ideals of a female. Most of the time,

playfulness is perceived as naivety in the case of a female artist, but in her work, she uses it as a means of power. Through play, she can see possibilities for new ways of being and affecting.

Collaboration plays an important part in her practice. Sarpaniemi is exploring intimacy and companionship through self-portraits she creates together with her close group of friends. The outcome of Sarpaniemi's work either photographed individually or in a collaboration with her friends is an outcome of a playful and modern yet timeless portrayal of womanhood.

MARTINA STAPF



Martina Stapf (*1990) lives and works in Vienna.

ARTISTIC APPROACH

This is an ongoing photo project that focuses on the relationship between humans, material and space.

The focus of this analogue photo series is on the examination of the relationship between body and space. Using a slightly different approach to space and its furniture, different poses and different image concepts develop playful connections between material and human. The movements are imaging and intuitive, this series works like an examination, breaking up the usual spatial and familiar contexts and creating new relationships.

These performative photographs stand in the tradition of self-staging and self-portrayal of the artists of the 1960s with the body serving as material. In addition to self-questioning and the exploration of internal psychological relationships, these photographs also visualize a multifaceted involvement with the sociopolitical discourse about role models, external-/self-perception, social positioning and identity formation.

The female body disappears behind, under or in different objects, the striking visibility of the self-timer symbolizes a self-determined act as an artist and woman.

A performance only for the camera, isolated and intimate, it is only made accessible to the viewer through photography alone. The room becomes a stage, where the different relationships are processed.

This project is ongoing since 2015.

ARTIST STATEMENT

My artistic work always deals with the human body as material. I use the body to examine the roles of movement, of the physical and how we articulate ourselves with it in different spaces. My photographs have a performative character, whereby my body serves as my projection surface from inside and outside.

Our body deals with all areas of social and physical relationships when it becomes a product of them. We move in different patterns, identify ourselves through different actions, spaces and relationships. I am interested in exactly these relationships between humans, material and space. Using my human body, I examine various structures and reflect on them

For me, this form of photography - the examination of the body as a medium - has become the main motif in my artistic practice. With photography I found the right medium for me to visualize my confrontations with daily structures.

ISABELLE WENZEL



With her new series 'Until Further Notice', Isabelle Wenzel manages to visualize a mental state we all can relate to since the start of the pandemic. As ever, her own body is Isabelle's focus. Made during the periods of confinement, she took the photographs in her house in Wuppertal, Germany. Some of the images show Isabelle's body that wraps itself around plants, tables and vacuum cleaners. On others she hangs over doors or stands on her head in the corner against the wall. It is not clear whether she plays with the furniture or is actually fighting and pushing against it. The result is a powerful image, in which the silent and private protest against the lockdown measures becomes eminent.

Isabelle Wenzel (b. 1982, Wuppertal, GER) studied to be a photographer/artist, but is also a trained acrobat. Usually, she sets her own body before the camera. Within the seconds that the self-timer allows her, she assumes an impossible position and continues to hold it until the camera has clicked.

The central focus of the photographs of Isabelle Wenzel is the body as a physical form, rather than people themselves. By making a photograph, she freezes a pose in time as it were, and in doing so draws attention to the sculptural qualities of the body. In order to achieve a certain image, the manoeuvres need to be carried out repeatedly. In this way, Wenzel does her own little experimental performance in front of the camera, which captures it for us in 'frozen' form as a photograph.

ARTIST STATEMENT

I stretched forward. Felt sensations of heaviness. Was overwhelmed by choice. Got lost. Stumbled. Failed. Started again. I'm a space in the landscape. A geological formation. A botanical shape. An island of isolation. A thinking body. Look at me in slow motion. Look at me frozen in time.
